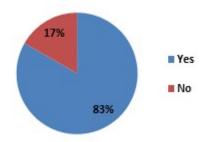

Are you aware you are able to contact the practice and book appointments and order prescriptions online via our practice website?

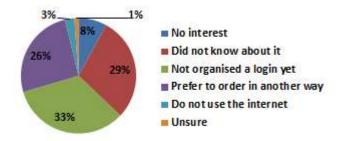


Do you request your prescription online?

Do you make appointments online?

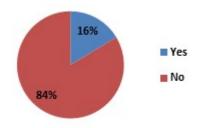


If you are not signed up for online access could you tell us why this is?

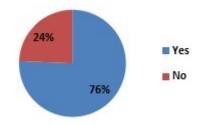
Do you use our practice website to access information on healthy living and advice on health conditions?

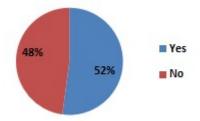


If the service was available, would you:

Ask a clinician for non-urgent advice via our website?

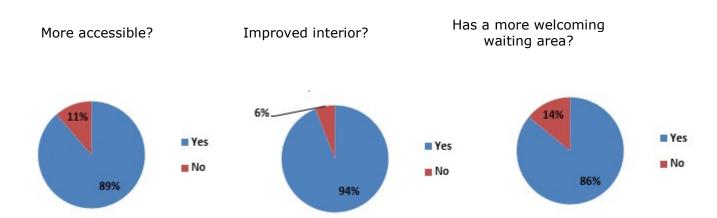

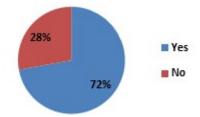
Building Renovations

If you use Carterknowle practice regularly, do you find the practice: (Since the building renovations)



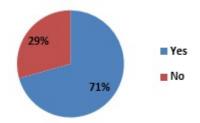
Centralised Telephone Service / Shared Resources
